Graduating fellows are expected to understand the multidisciplinary approach to endocrine tumors and disorders, including evaluation and management, operative approach, and follow-up.
Application Eligibility and Requirements	Fellowship candidates must have completed a general surgery residency and be BC/BE. Applications should include: 1. Curriculum Vitae. 2. Three letters of recommendation. 3. Personal statement (optional) 4. Photo
Application Deadlines	Applications are flexibly accepted and may be sent via email (preferred) or mail. The majority of interviews will be conducted in July and August for participation in the AAES-sponsored fellowship match for the following academic year.
Highlights of the Fellowship (including number of cases and a brief description of the overall program)	<p>This program is a collaborative program between Endocrine Surgery (Department of Surgery, Division of Surgical Oncology) and Head and Neck Surgery (Department of Otolaryngology). The fellow will spend 7-8 months working with the Endocrine Surgery faculty (Dr. Douglas Evans, Dr. Tracy Wang, and Dr. Tina Yen) and 2 months working with the Head and Neck Surgery faculty (Dr. Bruce Campbell, Dr. Becky Massey, and Dr. Michael Stadler). The remainder of the fellowship will be spent with participating faculty in Endocrinology and Radiology.</p> <p>The fellow will perform 150 – 200 major surgical endocrine cases during the period of surgical training. Cases include, but are not limited to thyroidectomy and cervical lymph node dissection, minimally invasive parathyroidectomy, reoperative surgery of the neck, and open and laparoscopic adrenalectomy (retroperitoneal and transabdominal approaches). Fellows will also have the opportunity to perform and become proficient in FNA and fiberoptic laryngoscopy. There is an opportunity for an independent clinic at the Veterans Administration Hospital.</p> <p>In addition to departmental and institutional conferences, the fellow will participate in the weekly Endocrine Surgery research meeting and will have exposure to the principles of conducting clinical research, scientific communications, surgical education, research ethics and management.</p>
