<b>Eligibility</b>	The fellowship is designed for individuals who have completed their general surgery training and seek to develop a career in endocrine surgery. Application should include: 1. Curriculum Vitae. 2. Cover letter stating reason for applying for Endocrine Surgery and future career plans. 3. Three professional letters of recommendation.  Full applications are due by June 30th. Applications may be emailed, or mailed. Interviews will be granted after review of the above application materials, and likely will be conducted in July. AAES-sponsored match lists are due early September.
<b>Fellowship Aims</b>	Provide advanced endocrine surgical training and research opportunities in the field of Endocrine Surgery. This will be conducted in an academic department emphasizing preoperative evaluation, operative skills and long-term management of patients with endocrine diseases, complex inherited endocrine syndromes, and advanced and metastatic cancers. The fellows will have exposure to thyroid/parathyroid/neck sonography, indirect laryngoscopy, fine needle aspirations, thyroid cytology, nuclear medicine scans, 4D CT scanning. The fellows also will have exposure to enrolling patients with nonresectable and metastatic thyroid and adrenal cancers in international clinical trials utilizing novel chemotherapeutic agents at Yale.
<b>Fellowship Description and Curriculum</b>	Intensive endocrine surgery training with 4 experienced endocrine surgeons (Sanziana Roman, MD, Julie Ann Sosa MA MD, Tobias Carling MD PhD, and Robert Udelsman, MD) emphasizing the multidisciplinary care of the patient. Our wealth of endocrine surgical cases ( <b>over 500 thyroid, 400 parathyroid, 40 modified radical cervical lymphadenectomies, 30 adrenal and 5 endocrine pancreatic procedures per year</b> ) will afford the fellow extensive operative experience combined with advanced techniques including minimally invasive parathyroidectomy, laparoscopic adrenalectomy and neck dissections. Our fellows finish the fellowship having performed between 385-515 procedures per year.  The fellow will participate in clinical and translational research and, under appropriate mentorship, make substantive contributions to the scientific literature. The fellow will actively participate in weekly endocrine multi-specialty conferences and interact extensively with endocrinology, cytology, sonography and nuclear medicine.
