AAES Policy on Academic Integrity

The American Association of Endocrine Surgeons is dedicated to maintaining the highest standards of academic integrity. Abstract, manuscript, and grant submissions will require confirmation of the following statements:

I certify that:

- 1. I am the author of the material I am submitting to the AAES.
- 2. This research has been conducted with approval of the appropriate ethics board(s), institutional review board(s), or is in compliance with the Declaration of Helsinki.
- 3. All authors are responsible for all aspects of the work related to quality, accuracy, and integrity and agree to investigate and resolve any questions about the work.
- 4. All authors listed have made substantial contributions to the conception or design of the work, acquisition, analysis, or interpretation of data for the work, and/or drafting or critical revision of the work.
- 5. Final approval of the version to be submitted for review and/or publication has been agreed to by all authors.
- 6. This is original work that has never been published or presented at another meeting outside of the institution of origin.
- 7. All manuscript submission and presentation/manuscript related meeting deadlines for the AAES Annual Meeting as published on the meeting website and in official communications will be adhered to. If unable to meet a deadline, the AAES Recorder will be immediately notified by the submitting and/or senior author. Deadline extensions are rare and must be approved by the Recorder with input from the AAES Officers. Failure to meet these deadlines may result in removal of the presentation from the program, loss of submission privileges to be included in the meeting issue, and/or rejection of the manuscript.

The AAES reserves the right to sanction individuals who respond falsely to the above or who are found to have committed academic misconduct, including but not limited to plagiarism, double-publishing, or performing research without proper institutional review and/or oversight. In cases of academic misconduct involving the above items or other commonly accepted items revolving around academic misconduct, at the discretion of the AAES Executive Council, the AAES may prohibit individuals from submitting abstracts to the annual meeting for up to 3 years or may issue other sanctions, including but not limited to barring or revoking membership in the organization.
